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comprehensive and up to datethe first contemporary publication to go beyond examining broad themes and trends in the field this timely volume looks closely at specific authors and texts the book is comprehensive and as current as possible covering works by african american authors for young adults published between 1968 1993 some 200 titles by close to 50 writers in addition to established authors and bestselling titles the coverage includes material overlooked by previous studies such as works from small presses and talented new authors guidlines for evaluationan extensive introduction reviews important milestones in this body of literature and analyzes noteworthy bibliographical and critical publications about such writing it includes suggested guidelines for evaluating a work in terms of its direct and indirect treatment of such issues as race gender class ability age sexuality and sexual orientation the book also offers specific guidance for determining the appropriate readership for a work with regard to age and gender unusually extensive annotationsthe main body of the book is an annotated bibliography alphabetical by author with the works arranged chronologically by publication date the annotations are much more extensive than those in other bibliographies each annotation reads more like a full length book review and is from one to two pages long and explores themes plot and character development evaluates the quality of the writing judges the handling of issues of race class and gender and provides a readership recommendation written in accessible language this user friendly book presents a wide range of factual information evaluations and analyses it is a valuable tool for all teachers librarians counselors and young adults

the literature on rural america to the extent that it exists has largely been written by urban based scholars perpetuating out of date notions and stereotypes or by those who see little difference between rural and agricultural concerns as a result the real rural america remains much misunderstood neglected or ignored by scholars and policymakers alike in response emery castle offers the changing american countryside a volume that will forever change how we look at this important subject castle brings together the writings of eminent scholars from several disciplines and varying backgrounds to take a fresh and comprehensive look at the forgotten hinterlands these authors examine the role of non metropolitan people and places in the economic life of our nation and cover such diverse issues as poverty industry the environment education family social problems ethnicity race religion gender government public policy and regional diversity the authors are especially effective in demonstrating why rural america is so much more than just agriculture it is in fact highly diverse complex and interdependent with urban america and the international market place most major rural problems they contend simply cannot be effectively addressed in isolation from their urban and international connections to do so is misguided and even hazardous when one fourth of our population and ninety seven per cent of our land area is rural together these writings not only provide a new and more realistic view of rural life and public policy but also suggest how the field of rural studies can greatly enrich our understanding of national life

this is a single source guide to articles appearing each year in all major black american journals providing coverage of important literature in the field of black studies among the areas covered in each annual edition are women related issues literature education economics discrimination health care music dance theatre and film interviews obituaries and book and drama reviews are also included entries are arranged by subject and author in convenient dictionary format with extensive cross referencing

rules about sexuality written and unwritten have existed in every culture as have disagreements over what is and isn t acceptable must morally permissible sex have only one function must it be heterosexual must it occur within the confines of the institution of marriage must it be accompanied by requisite emotions such as love and intimacy

this book offers new perspectives on the understanding of adult basic skills and literacy it identifies the critical information needs in this area and suggests ways of closing the information gap through case studies and large scale surveys the chapters give an overview of the different research and policy traditions in literacy and address key technical issues in measurement and assessment the implications and options for policy intervention are considered in light of changing conceptions of theory and measurement

examines a handful of famous ocean explorers and naturalists including jacque cousteau thor heyerdahl and rachel carson among others to demonstrate how their work helped shape the way many americans would think about and interact with the ocean

focuses on the 19th century transformation in san francisco from gold rush to earthquake to show how the city s diverse residents created a modern american city through everyday cultural frontiers such as restaurants hotels and annual fairs and expositions among others

a truly interdisciplinary approach this text incorporates biological psychological and sociological perspectives to the study of the family

ranging broadly from andrew jackson to bill clinton and george w bush stuckey demonstrates how presidents accomplish the dual enactment of inclusion and exclusion through their rhetorical and political choices our early leaders were preoccupied with balancing the growing nation later presidents were concerned with the nature and definitions of citizenship by examining the political speeches of presidents exemplifying distinctly different circumstances she presents a series of snapshots which when taken together reveal both the continuity and the changes in our national self understanding

shaffer chronicles the postwar transition of black veterans from the union army as well as their subsequent life patterns political involvement family and marital life experiences with social welfare comradeship with other veterans and memories of the war itself he draws on such sources as civil war pension records to fashion a collective biography a social history of both ordinary and notable lives resurrecting the words and memories of many black veterans to provide an intimate view of their lives and struggles book jacket

in the late 1930s a number of american women especially those allied with various peace and isolationist groups protested against the nation s entry into world war ii while their story is fairly well known margaret paton walsh reveals a far less familiar story of women who fervently felt that american intervention was absolutely necessary paton walsh recounts how the united states became involved in the war but does so through the eyes of american women who faced it as a necessary evil covering the period between 1935 and 1941 she examines how these women functioned as political actors even though they were excluded from positions of power through activism in women s organizations informal women s networks and even male dominated lobbying groups in the great debate over whether america should enter the war some women favored aid to the allies not because they hoped for war but because they hoped aid would forestall more direct u s involvement but also because they believed war was preferable to a nazi victory paton walsh shows that this activism involved some of the most prominent women of their day elizabeth cutter morrow whose son in law charles lindbergh was an isolationist spokesman supported the revision of the neutrality acts to allow the sale of arms to the allies and expressed her support in a national radio broadcast soon other women joined this debate esther brunauer of the aaup journalist dorothy thompson and organizations like the league of women voters and national women s trade union league broke from the pacifist tradition to advocate american aid for the allied cause focusing on the conflict in europe paton walsh shows how these women grasped the implications of the lend lease program for america s entry into the war but supported it nevertheless by late 1941 the women s division of the fight for freedom committee had been established no longer merely advocating aid to britain to keep american boys out of battle this organization supported direct american involvement in the war as a means of stopping nazi oppression while most historians have focused on women s pacifism paton walsh connects women more directly to world events and shows how those interventionists reformulated maternalist ideas to justify and explain their beliefs our war too is a story of american women trying to reconcile the irreconcilable to preserve both their principles and their peace it expands our understanding of women as political actors and thinkers about foreign policy as it sheds new light on american public opinion over the build up to the war
